We know many different names. People recognize each other by their names. That's why there are different names in the world. Where does a name come from? What do they mean? I want to present my personal name.

My name is Andrej. In English-talking countries that name is Andrew. There are many explanations of this name. I will describe two of them. The name Andrew comes from Greece.

One explanation says:

"Andrew" comes from the Greek name Av $\delta p \epsilon \alpha \varsigma$ (Andreas), which derives from $\alpha v \eta \rho$ (aner) "man" (genitive $\alpha v \delta \rho \circ \varsigma$ (andros) "of a man"). In the New Testament the apostle Andrew was the brother of the apostle Simon Peter. According to a legend he was crucified on an X-shaped cross, and he is the patron saint of Scotland, Russia, and Greece. This was also the name of kings of Hungary. Another explanation says:

"Andrew" comes from Greek and means "courageous".
